


NINO SERDARUŠIĆ AND BLAŽ ROLA WIN DOUBLES TOURNAMENT AFTER A DRAMATIC BATTLE

WAWRINKA DOMINATES, POPYRIN MAKES IT THROUGH AFTER A TOUGH FIGHT



Swiss player Stan Wawrinka and Australia's Alexei Popyrin will face off on Sunday at 8 p.m. in the final match of the Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag tournament. In the semi-finals, Wawrinka played what might have been his best match this year at Stella Maris, defeating Italian Lorenzo Sonego 6:3, 6:4.

Popyrin also made it through to the final match after defeating an Italian player, but not as smoothly (6:7 (2), 7:5, 6:3). This will be the first match between these two players

Popyrin reached his second ATP tournament final after an exhausting match which lasted 3 hours and 18 minutes. They haven't broken the all time record of this tournament (in 2011, Slovenian Kavčić and Argentinian Berlocq played for 3 hours and 41 minutes), but it was by far the longest match this season in Umag. The Australian might have gone to the finals a bit more easily, though. In the first set, he lost his break point advantage, and he kept missing his chances in the second set. He had 8 break points, four of them set points at a score of 5:4. However, after winning a game at his opponent's serve in the 12th game, Arnaldi couldn't keep up any more. Popyrin achieved a break point that gave him a 3:1 lead, and in the third set he lost only 5 points at his serve. Stats show that the Australian had as many as 19 break points, but he used only 4.

"This was probably the most difficult match I've ever played. I was already tired after the first set, but i tried to keep my spirits up. I intend to be ready for the finals, I have nearly 24 hours to recover. I'll probably skip breakfast and get a good sleep in," said Popyrin.

This Sunday, the Australian will try to win his second title at a tournament of this level, after winning in 2021 in Singapore. This was undoubtedly the best result of an Australian player in Umag, since the only other Australian player to have played at Stella Maris in these 33 years was Simon Youl in 1994, who was eliminated at the very start of the tournament. Christopher O'Connell was also here this year, but he didn't make it past the first round.



Popyrin faces Stan Wawrinka on Sunday, who defeated Italian Sonego without losing a single serve. He was faced with a single break point, at his serve for the first set, and the situation was somewhat similar at his match point serve, putting Sonego at a promising 0-30. But that was about it for Sonego...

This will be the 31st big finale for Wawrinka, but only his first since Antwerp in 2019. He has won 16 titles, including three singles titles at Grand Slam tournaments. "I have played my best match of the week, at a high level. I'm really happy to be in the final after all these years," said Wawrinka, who's semi-final victory came after midnight. "I've been attempting something like this ever since I returned to tennis after my surgeries. It was already a big deal to win the doubles tournament in Gstaad last week; that gave me an extra push," said the Swiss player, who was once the third best player in the world, and this year joined us in Umag (where he won his first ever ATP tournament title back in 2006), as the 72nd player in the rankings.

The final match of the doubles tournament was played on Saturday, when Nino Serdarušić and Blaž Rola faced off against Simone Bolelli and Andrea Vavassori from Italy.

The Croatian-Slovenian team played an amazing match full of twists and turns, and in the end managed to win the Umag ATP tournament (4:6, 7:6, 15:13).

This is a tremendous success for them. Now all we've got left is the singles final match, taking place on Sunday.

NINO SERDARUŠIĆ AND BLAŽ ROLA SAVE THREE MATCH POINTS ON THEIR WAY TO THE TOP IN UMAG!

Croatian Nino Serdarušić and Slovenian Blaž Rola won the doubles tournament at the Plava Laguna Croatia Open! Although they have never played together until this week, and they agreed to play in the tournament at the last moment. they won the title after a dramatic match, where their opponents had three match points. Having eliminated the second seeded team in the semi-finals, and disposing of the top-seeded pair, Italians Simone Bolelli and Andrea Vavassori, in the finals (4:6, 7:6 (2), 15:13), they took what was the first doubles title for either of them in an ATP tournament. It was an extremely tense match, where the Croatian-Slovenian pair managed to take advantage of the third match point having previously saved three match points.

"It was crazy, This whole story is crazy. I came here to play in the qualifiers, didn't make it to the draw, and then Nino asked me if I wanted to play in the doubles. Tournament director Tomislav Poljak told us that they had an invitation for us maybe an hour before the draw, and I think it was worth it," said Rola. Nino

added: "I really hope that we will be able to play doubles in most of the tournaments, alongside our individual careers. Here we managed to defeat four extraordinary teams who play together week after week."

Bolelli and Vavassori were better at the start, and even had a 6:4, 3:1 lead at one point. Still, the Croatian-Slovenian pair fought back and took the tie break a bit later, leading to a third set nail-biter. Serdarušić and Rola had a 8:4 lead, but the Italians had three match points (9:8, 11:10 and 12:11), before Nino and Blaž managed to snatch the title. Several match points met with the net, which took the already high tension to the next level.

It should be noted that in the 33 years that the Umag tournament has been played, this is the first time that a Croatian player won the doubles title, after six defeats in final matches. A total of eight Croatian players played the finals in Umag, and Nino, as the ninth one, is the first to be crowned winner.

Bolelli was defending his title in Umag, after having won the doubles last year with fellow Italian Fabio Fognini. That final match was also very thrilling, as his team managed to save 8 match points (two at 5:6 in the second set, and when they were losing 0:6 in the tie break in the same set). He also won the title in Umag in 2011. Rola is the first Slovenian player ever with a doubles title at an ATP tournament.





PETER PEVC WINS THIS YEAR'S JOURNALISTS' TOURNAMENT

The journalists' tournament, Ico Kerhin Memorial, played for the 33rd time during the Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag, was won by Peter Pevc from Sport Klub Slovenija. Pevc defeated his colleague, journalist Ilvio Vidovich from Ubitennis, who had previously won the tournament for four years in a row.

"It's always great to play in the journalists' tournament, the energy is off the charts. When it comes to tennis, I think I played very well, but what mattered most to me was that



we all have a good time together, and share our experiences and passion for sports," said Pevc after his victory.

The tournament was played on the courts at the ATP tournament in Umag. The winning trophy was awarded by Tomislav Puljak, tournament director. The prizes for the finalists where secured by VAT d.o.o., exclusive distributor for Babolat, and handed out by Iva Modrušan Dankić.

THE FOURTH ANNUAL RECREATIONAL STARS OPEN TOURNAMENT COMES TO AN END WITHOUT A HITCH

The fourth annual recreational Stars Open tournament took place during this year's Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag. From 26 to 29 July, a total of 150 players showed their skills on the courts in Umag, competing in four categories: singles, pro singles, doubles, and pro doubles.



The Stars Open Tour is the largest recreational tournament in Croatia, taking place in multiple locations. More than 10 tournaments are usually played throughout the year, drawing in recreational players from all around the country.

Some of the players who played at Stella Maris were the famous attorney Mate Matić, chess master Alojzije Janković, Brazilian model and winner of last year's edition of Croatia's "Dancing with the Stars" Pedro Soltz, and many others.

The winner in the pro singles category was Dario Večerić, in the singles category Tomislav Miškić, in the pro double category the Božićević and Božićević team, and in the double category the Lažnjak and Prgomet team.

ATP STAFF IS OF GREAT ASSISTANCE WE'RE IN FOR A FANTASTIC FINAL **DURING THE TOURNAMENT**



Umag is the smallest town in the ATP tournament calendar, and the smallest member of the ATP family, but there are certain advantages to this position, as it is somewhat easier to organise. Of course, the ATP is extremely generous with its assistance in so many aspects, such as marketing, rule interpretation, implementation and improvement of standards for tennis players, etc. It's all we have when we're preparing the tournament.

When it comes to the very operation during these ten or so days, of course there is no greater help than that provided by the ATP staff at everyone's disposal and leading the charge. This team is helmed by the head official, supervisor Gerry Armstrong, whose career is nothing short of impressive. If there is ever a Hall of Fame for officials, he's the prime candidate. His career at Wimbledon lasted for 50 years. A few days ago I asked him how many times he'd been in Umag. He couldn't remember, but in the end we came to the conclusion that this might be his 27th year at our tournament.

After all these seasons, he's become a sort of a trade mark at our tournament. He is entrusted with the implementation of the tournament, the scheduling, and ensuring that the matches are played in accordance with the ATP Tour rules in force. These rules are comprised in books 200 to 250 pages long, depending on the edition, and they cover absolutely everything: starting with the basis so that the tournament could even work - court size, light intensity, balls - all the way to precise instructions, such as what the players can wear, or what can and cannot happen when it comes to advertising. Gerry's job is implementing these rules. Another very important person is the Tour Manager. He's here to represent and protect the players' interests, take care of the schedule, make sure that the conditions, such as the hotel and transportation, are up to par, and that the players receive only the best in Umag, of course within reasonable limits

There's also a multitude of people taking care of the players' health, including two physical therapists. We can't forget the chair umpires. We provide additional physical therapists, a doctor, and line umpires.

Stan played phenomenally. In the statement he gave on the court, he said that this was his best match of the week, and I fully agree. With the way he played, Sonego never stood a

chance. It's now quite realistic to expect Wawrinka to win the title in Umag again, but he'll have to be at his best on Sunday. Both he and Popyrin are hard hitters and I think we can look forward to an amazing final match.

Nino and Blaž have done something truly wonderful. They agreed to play together in the locker rooms just before the draw, received an invitation and ended up winning the whole thing. The tie break was unbelievable, and I'm so happy that so many people came to see this match live and cheered loudly. The atmosphere was fantastic, and the guys truly deserved it. After all these years, it is awesome to have a winning pair include a Croatian player, although no one could have predicted this at the start.

And so the final match is all that is left. Umag always has at least one crazy story. We already saw one of them unfold in the doubles tournament, and another could be coming on Sunday. We've come to the end, only two players remain, both of whom have given their all thus far. If they keep it up in the final match, it will be the icing on the cake for the end of the 33rd edition of the tournament
