UMAG TITLE HEADS TO SPAIN AGAIN AS DANIEL MERIDA CLAIMS CROATIA OPEN CROWN

The 21-year-old Daniel Merida is the champion of this year's Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag! The Spaniard dropped a set for the first time all week in the final, after coming within touching distance of victory, but ultimately prevailed over Bosnia and Herzegovina's Damir Džumhur 6-2, 5-7, 6-2 to capture the biggest title of his career. Prior to Umag, his best ATP Tour result had been a runner-up finish in Bucharest earlier this April.

"This is huge. Winning a big tournament for the first time is an incredible feeling. When I was serving for the match, I got a little nervous, and Damir started playing much better. I'm absolutely thrilled with this result," said Merida, who received the winner's trophy from the President of the Republic of Croatia, Zoran Milanović.

Merida dominated the opening set, with his forehand proving particularly devastating. He also secured an early break in the second set to move ahead 4-2, but that was when the momentum shifted. Having been broken only twice in his previous four matches throughout the tournament, Merida suddenly lost serve four consecutive times after taking that 4-2 lead, including the game when he served for the championship at 5-4. Džumhur produced a remarkable comeback to level the match at one set all, but he was unable to match the Spaniard's intensity in the decider. Merida arrived in Umag ranked No. 82 in the world—a career-high at the time—and is now guaranteed to break into the ATP Top 60 when the new rankings are released on Monday.

"People always say there's room for improvement, but considering how much energy I'd spent, I believe I gave everything I had. I surprised myself with how hard I was able to fight, but eventually I just ran out of fuel. Merida was incredibly aggressive, and I tried everything to disrupt his rhythm," said Džumhur, who made his ninth appearance in Umag. After reaching the semifinals last year, he went one step further this time by making the final.

"I don't know whether the results will continue on an upward trajectory next year, but if I stay healthy, I'll definitely be back," he added.

This marks the 12th Plava Laguna Croatia Open title won by a Spanish player, meaning Spaniards have now claimed exactly one-third of all championships in the tournament's history. Carlos Moyá remains the event's most successful player with five titles, while Carlos Alcaraz was the last Spaniard to lift the trophy before Merida, doing so in 2021. Notably, every Spanish champion in Umag has gone on to reach at least the world's Top 10 at some stage of their career.

Džumhur remains on three ATP Tour titles, while this was the fifth tour-level final of his career. Had he lifted the trophy on Saturday, he would have become the oldest champion in the history of the Umag tournament. That distinction, for now, continues to belong to Spain's Tommy Robredo.

I truly believe we did a fantastic job preparing for the tournament from every possible angle. The player field was one of the strongest we've had in recent years, and then things unfolded the way they did. I was feeling pretty low for a couple of days — almost depressed. My colleagues and the rest of the team kept telling me, "That's not you." But when you've spent months building something, it's incredibly difficult to watch the draw, so to speak, fall apart before your eyes. That was painful and hard to accept.

In situations like that, though, something good always comes out of it. Full credit to Daniel Merida. We've gained a player who, I'm sure, will be coming back to Umag. He told us the tournament was fantastic, that he loved being here and that everything had been perfect. And he wasn't talking about the result, because at that point he hadn't even reached the semifinals yet. He's a young clay-court specialist who plays outstanding tennis, and at his best I genuinely believe he already has the potential to become a Top 20 player in the world.

That said, the real story of this year's tournament is Damir Dzumhur. He gave absolutely everything. I think he spent a total of twelve and a half hours on court across five matches. Moments like these are exactly why I love this job and why I love my role. You build a relationship with a player who knows how much he matters to us. Of course, he also knows he has a great opportuni-

ty to achieve something special here, and when all those elements come together, it creates something truly memorable.

We have enormous respect for Damir, and after this tournament we almost consider him one of our own. I believe this edition of the Croatia Open will be remembered for him, just as the 2023 tournament is remembered for Stan Wawrinka and what felt like the final chapter of his remarkable career.

This is my eleventh year in Umag — five as assistant tournament director and six as tournament director. This season, without question, I had the best team I've worked with in all those years. Our grounds crew prepared world-class courts. Arnaud Gabas, who officiated here in 2022, said he was amazed by the standard of the courts this year. My sincere thanks go to every one of those people. The same goes for our security staff, while our drivers continue to be among the very best on the ATP Tour, something that's consistently reflected in the outstanding feedback we receive in ATP reports. Our cleaning staff deserve the same recognition.

Most importantly, we didn't have a single major issue throughout the tournament.

This is my heartfelt thank you to everyone who contributed in any way — nearly 500 people altogether. The local community truly lives this tournament, and for that I can't thank them enough.

MERIDA IS GOOD, BUT HE STILL HAS A LONG WAY TO GO

Deserved and expected—that's probably the best way to sum up the final. A day earlier, I predicted that, given all the circumstances, Daniel Merida would come out on top, and that's exactly what happened. We took everything that mattered into account, with the biggest factor being everything Damir Dzumhur had to go through just to reach the final.

In the end, the Spaniard lifted the trophy, although there was a moment when it looked as he might let a winning match slip away. In fact, I believe that would have happened had Dzumhur had a little more left in the tank and managed to maintain the momentum he built after taking the second set. Merida became visibly nervous and missed the chance to finish a match in straight sets for the fifth time this week, but the full comeback never materialised.

I think Merida is a young player with tremendous promise, but time will tell whether he'll go on to build the kind of career we've come to expect from the great Spanish players we've seen in Umag over the years. He's an excellent prospect. He plays at a high tempo, has a terrific forehand, but there are still several areas of his game that require a great deal of work.

His serve simply isn't where it needs to be for the highest level of professional tennis, and there's enormous room for improvement there. I don't know who taught him how to hit an overhead, but they didn't do the best job. He

also needs to stop discussing points with his girlfriend and looking to her after rallies. I understand that his coach wasn't with him this week, and perhaps things are different when they're together, but he came very close to letting this match slip away. To sum it up, I like what I see, and I believe this is only the beginning for him, but there's still a very long road ahead if he wants to become the complete player.

Neither of the finalists—or even the semifinalists—began the tournament as the leading favourites to make a deep run. That certainly affected the perception of the closing stages, but not the quality of tennis we ended up watching. In fact, it turned out to be an excellent finish to the tournament. We had the compelling story of Dzumhur's marathon matches, the maiden title of a player who looks destined to keep developing, the great atmosphere Umag is known for, and an entertaining final.

There is really nothing to complain about. Once again, we saw that even when the biggest names fall short, those waiting in the wings are capable of stepping up and delivering a tournament worthy of the occasion.



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GERRY ARMSTRONG RETIRES

Long-serving ATP Supervisor Gerry Armstrong served in his role at the Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag for the final time this week, bringing to a close a remarkable chapter in the tournament's history. Over the years, he became one of the event's most recognizable faces—hardly surprising considering he first arrived in Umag as an ATP official back in 1994.

Armstrong has been one of the most respected figures in professional tennis officiating for nearly five decades. As an ATP Supervisor, he has overseen countless tournaments around the world, while also enjoying a distinguished career as a chair umpire, officiating many of the sport's biggest matches, including the Wimbledon Gentlemen's Singles Final.

He began his officiating career in 1973 as a line umpire at Wimbledon. By the time he stepped down from chair umpiring in 2015, he had officiated an impressive 13 Wimbledon finals, a testament to the respect and trust he earned throughout his career.

In recognition of his outstanding contribution to both the tournament and the sport, Gerry Armstrong was presented with a commemorative gift by Arlen Brozić, Chair of the Executive Board of the Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag, and Tomislav Poljak, Tournament Director.





PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC ZORAN MILANOVIC ATTENDS THE PLAVA LAGUNA CROATIA OPEN UMAG FINAL

President of the Republic of Croatia Zoran Milanovic attended the final of the 36th Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag on Saturday, which saw Spain's Daniel Merida face Bosnia and Herzegovina's Damir Dzumhur. The Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag is held under the patronage of the President of the Republic of Croatia.

The final was also attended by Pero Cosic, envoy of the Speaker of the Croatian Parliament and Chairman of the Croatian Parliament's Committee on Elections, Appointments and Administrative Affairs, as well as Dr Irena Hrstic, envoy of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Croatia and Minister of Health.

An official trophy presentation ceremony was held following the match. As part of this year's Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag, the ITF Wheelchair Croatia Open Umag by HEP was held once again, bringing together top wheelchair tennis players from across Europe.

Competing in a field of 16 players from seven countries, Ante Kolundija claimed the title. He was awarded the trophy after his opponent in the final, Germany's Anthony Dittmar, was forced to withdraw due to injury before the match began.

The winner's trophy was presented by Goran Ivanišević, while Arlen Brozic, director of the tournament executive board, also took part in the award ceremony and congratulated everyone involved on another successfully organized event.

Three Croatian players competed in this year's tournament: Ante Kolundija, Sven Maretic and Anto Joskic, who is also the tournament organizer and one of the key figures behind the development of wheelchair tennis in Croatia.

„We are delighted with the successful conclusion of another edition of our tournament. I am especially happy that, for the first time, we have a Croatian singles champion, so congratulations to Ante. I would also like to thank Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag and HEP for helping us promote our sport and, at the same time, raise awareness of the importance of inclusion for people with disabilities. The tournament has been a great success, and I believe we have truly become an integral part of the Umag tournament. We are already looking forward to next year and the eighth edition,” said Joskic.

Over the years, the ITF Wheelchair Croatia Open Umag by HEP has become an important part of the Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag programme. In addition to providing players with the opportunity to earn valuable ITF World Ranking points, the tournament continues to raise the profile of wheelchair tennis and promote sport for people with disabilities.

The event is also made possible through the „Ace to the Rescue” charity initiative, supported by Hrvatska elektroprivreda (HEP), a long-standing partner of the Umag tournament. The initiative is based on the total number of aces served during the tournament, with a donation made for every ace. The funds raised are invested in the organization of the ITF Wheelchair Croatia Open Umag by HEP and the continued development of wheelchair tennis.

During a conversation with Ivan Vukusic, she shared what her pre-match routine looks like before taking part in the Stella Artois Perfect Serve Challenge.

After a short break following the London tournaments, she says she feels refreshed and ready for the challenges ahead. The next chapter of her career will also feature a familiar face, as respected British coach David Felgate has rejoined her team. Felgate first coached Donna when she was just 12 years old, giving their renewed partnership a special emotional significance.

Donna Vekic's appearance once again confirmed that the ATP Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag is not only a world-class sporting event, but also a place where tennis fans can meet their sporting idols away from the court and become part of the unique Stella Artois experience.

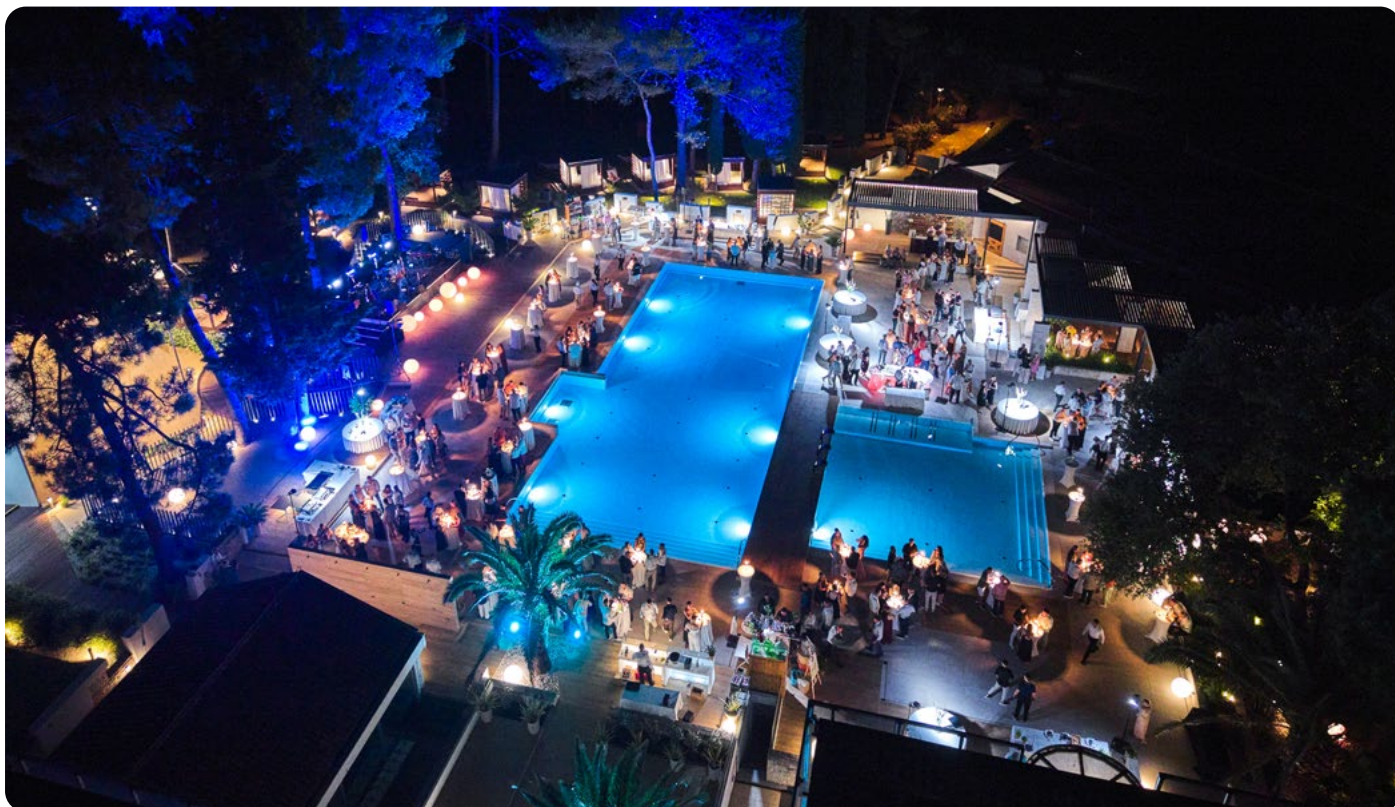
Guests enjoyed a relaxed atmosphere, outstanding cuisine, carefully selected wines and an entertaining music programme. The evening opened with a

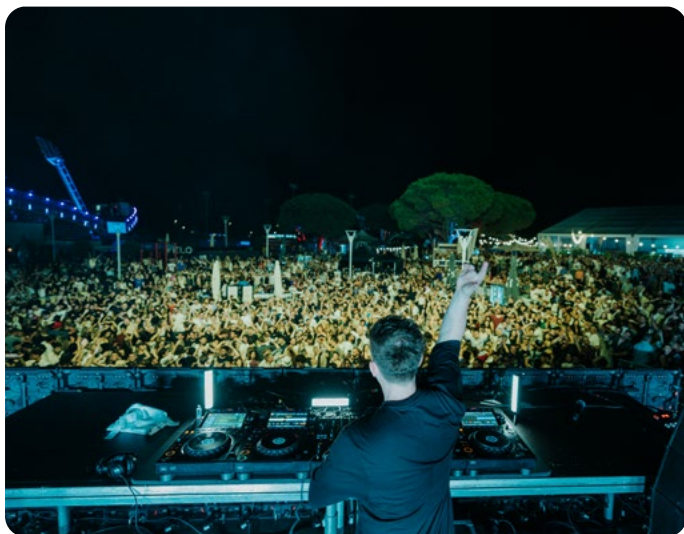

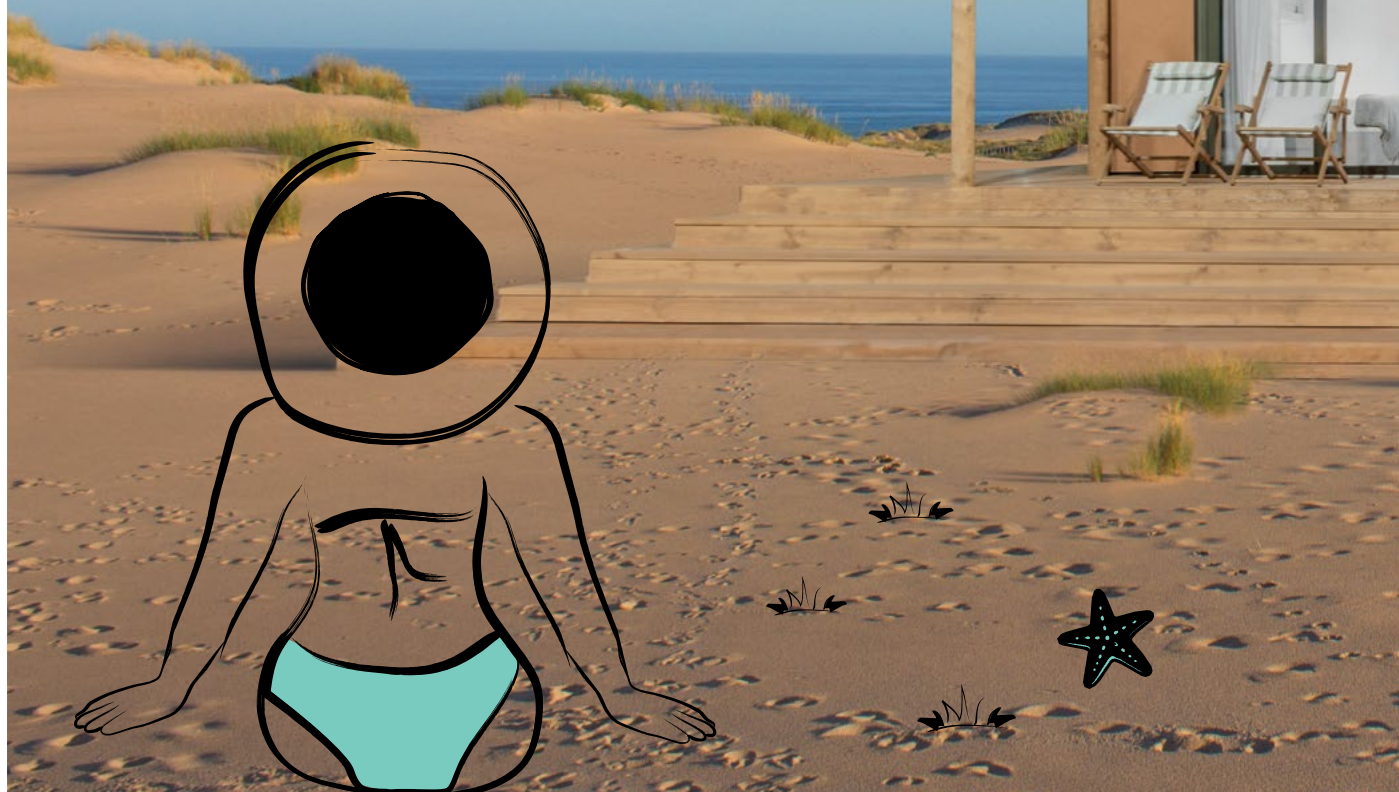
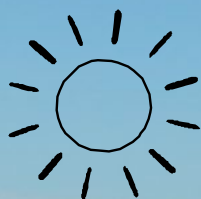
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
