

The time we've spent on preparation is behind us, from the day last year's tournament ended, and we've done everything with the desire to make the new edition just as successful as the last.

We were very pleased when we saw the list of registered players, some of whom are among the best in the world. Some of them have been playing the best tennis of their careers this season, constantly moving towards the top of the rankings, and we'll also have the chance to see some of the most talented young players around who may soon join the company of the currently best ranked players.

This will make the coming week very interesting, and our two exhibition spectacles – the first of which between the two Gorans already filled the stadium, reminding us of 1990 when it all started – will complement what is already a strong and exciting main tournament.

The draw has brought us a few interesting matches starting right from the first round. One of these is a duel between Marco Cecchinato, the cu-

rrent tournament champion, and Aljaz Bedene, one of our most faithful friends. Aljaz has been after a big result in Umag for years, and Cecchinato's appetites are surely just as big as they were a year ago. Some brilliant tennis awaits us as well as a stadium full of Italian and Slovenian fans.

The second big match in the first round is between another former champ, Russian Andrey Rublev, and the always interesting Robin Haase. Last year, the two of them played one of the best matches of the tournament in the quarter-finals, but this year the draw has brought them together right at the start.

It won't be easy for the first stars of the tournament either. They will be free during the first round, but Fabio Fognini will be playing against a fellow Italian right at the beginning, either Travaglia or Fabbiano. Borna Coric, who has completely recovered from his injury, could be squaring off against brilliant young Frenchman Corentin Moutet.

With excellent qualifying matches featuring great players like young Germans Molleker and Altmaier, as well as the experienced Robredo and Berlocq, I'm sure that we'll be warming up for everything that awaits us in the best possible way. I wish all our players lots of luck, and I wish our visitors lots of good fun and great tennis.

I REGRET PLAYING IN UMAG ONLY ONCE

We're counting down the final hours before yet another edition of the Umag ATP tournament. The closer the matches get, the more we remember when it all started. Time has flown by – the tournament has been around for 30 years, which is quite a long time. However, the memories are still fresh, so we'd like to sum them up for you.

I remember a lot of details from the first edition of the tournament. To be completely honest, my plan was to play a tournament in Rome that was taking place that same week; in the early phase of my career, playing a tennis tournament as big as the Masters 1000 series on a clay court was a big deal. However, the ATP switched me and Prpic over to Umag, according to rules I didn't even know existed. They told us they had the right to switch us over to another tournament if it contributed to the development of tennis in that country.

We weren't exactly thrilled, as playing in Rome was supposed to be a big thing. But we came to Umag and we didn't regret it. Not just because of the results - who could complain about making the finals? Everything was great, we felt wonderful. You could tell everyone was making an effort, and you could tell they were learning, because it was the first time, and that's always especially hard. This kind of competition didn't exist before in Croatia, and I'm not just talking about tennis. What Umag did was completely new, and even then, we could see the direction the sport could go at a professional level.

There weren't many people on the stands, especially the first few days.

This showed how new it all was, how unknown. I loved that week, I didn't lose a set in the first few matches, and I had a tough match against Andrei Cherkasov in the semi-finals. I lost, and rightly so, to Prpic in the finals. Prpic played better and deserved to win, so I can say it was a lovely experience, even though no one wants to lose in the finals. I've forgotten some things from the finals, but someone reminds me of something every once and a while or I notice a detail. For example, yesterday I noticed being at a 4:3 break point in the third set and hitting a forehand volley into the third row of the stands.

But all in all, the tournament was a starting point for me. Everything started there, a lot of great things started happening that week. We went to the national cup in Dusseldorf and we won, even though we weren't even close to being favourites or potential winners. Then I took Boris Becker down in the first round of the Roland Garros and made it into the quarter-finals, then I made it to the semi-finals at Wimbledon. I don't know what would have happened if I'd played Rome instead of Umag, but that's how it went. Today, I only regret one thing: not playing in Umag more often, instead of just in 1990.

A REPLAY OF THE 1990 FINALS AT THE START OF THE 30TH EDITION OF THE UMAG ATP TOURNAMENT

STILL GREAT EVEN AFTER THIRTY YEARS!

If you weren't there, you can only regret it: Goran Ivanisevic and Goran Prpic once again presented themselves to audiences, thirty years after they squared off in the finals of the first edition of the ATP tournament in Umag! This time, they weren't playing for points or for prestige, but rather for the good cheer of the audience, which filled the stands of the main stadium at Stella Maris in huge numbers to enjoy the masterwork of these two tennis greats Some points were at a truly high level, possibly even worthy of a performance at the main tournament, showing that players this talented never forget some things. Goran and Goran weren't bothered by comments on their age – they took them stoically before taking the court to remind the audience of their match in the finals in the first edition of the tournament in 1990, which Prpic won in three sets. To help everyone get even more into the mood, video from the match was projected, reminding the audience of the days when professional tennis first came to Umag thirty years ago

The audience enjoyed watching Prpic's

and Ivanisevic's moves, getting into the action at the invitation of the two hosts, creating a brilliant atmosphere with plenty of great tennis, fun and a relaxed mood, just as you would expect from this kind of match. Prpic took the victory this time around as well after one set (6:4), but the result was the least important part. It can be said that this appealing exhibition match was the ideal continuation of the Croatia Open's tradition, and this 30th birthday celebration probably couldn't have started with better players than these two. Goran and Goran made Saturday evening at Stella Maris unforgettable, together with the cheerleaders who also deserved a round of applause.

However, this was just the first of two exhibition matches that will be played during the tournament this year. On Wednesday, at around 9:30, there will be another replay of a final match, but this time it will be the 2001 Wimbledon finals, when Goran Ivanisevic beat Australian Patrick Rafter. They will meet again at Stella Maris, giving audiences a new chance to greet these two tennis legends in the flesh!

GREAT MATCHES RIGHT FROM THE FIRST ROUND

The draw for this year's Croatia Open brought luck to some, but not so much to others; there will be world-class matches right from the first round of the tournament that will bring together opponents with big ambitions. One of these, in the third quarter of the draw, is sure to be a battle between last year's semi-finalist Robin Haase from the Netherlands and Andrey Rublev from Russia, the 2017 tournament champion. The winner of this match will go on to the eighth-finals to play the fourth seed, Dusan Lajovic from Serbia.

Croatian tennis players will surely not be complaining about the results of the draw. As one of four top seeds, Borna Coric will be free at the start of the tournament, and he will be playing against the winner of a match between Corentin Moutet and an as-of-yet unknown qualifier in the eighth-finals. Viktor Galovic and Nino Serdarusic, who were invited to play in the main tournament, will be playing in the first round against players who will be coming from the qualification round, which means they won't learn the names of their opponents until Monday. The first seed, Italian Fabio Fognini, will have bye at the start of the tournament, but his first opponent will be a fellow Italian: either Thomas Fabbiano or Stefano Travaglia. Marco Cecchinato, last year's champion, has been placed as the fifth seed for this year; he will be playing the first round against Slovenian Aljaz Bedene, which could also be a great match.

The main draw will start on Mon-



day, and eight matches of the first round of qualifications will be played on Sunday. The only Croatian player in action will be promising junior Admir Kalender, who was received the wild card; he will be playing against Hungarian Attila Balazs.

Another familiar name will be playing in the qualifications –

Spaniard Tommy Robredo, for whom Umag 2013 was the last of his twelve ATP singles titles. He is currently 168th on the singles rankings, which means his current ranking was not sufficient to allow him to enter the main tournament directly. He will begin his qualifications with a match against Miljan Zekic from Serbia.

30 YEARS

Croats took two titles

Croatian tennis has been represented in Umag singles finals on three occasions. First, during the inaugural event in 1990, when Goran Prpic defeated Goran Ivanisevic. It took two decades for the

next Croat to reach another final, when Marin Cilic lost to Ukrainian Alexandr Dolgopolov in 2011. In 2012, Cilic made a comeback and won the Croatia Open title.
