












THE YOUNGEST SEMIFINALISTS OF UMAG



THE TOURNAMENT IS GREAT

We always complain about something, but I said at the beginning and I stand by it now: we have a great tournament this year as well. Although we are in the Olympic Games season and some other tournaments are played now as well, and we had bad luck with the cancellation of great players such as Fabio Fognini, Lorenzo Musetti and Jannik Sinner, there is no room for complaints about the quality of participants or the quality of tennis.

Umag always goes that way, there is a special story. And I am very satisfied with the quality of tennis, we watch several top matches every day. As for the players who entered the finals, Richard Gasquet is the most resounding name according to "old merits," because he is a player who was among the top ten in the world. We know how talented he is. Unfortunately, he was unlucky with injuries, he's aging, but in my opinion, along with Stan Wawrinka, he is the player with the best one-handed backhand in the history of tennis.

We have the young Alcaraz, who will be a big star and it's really great that we brought him to Umag, to be seen playing with us here.

The lineup of players who came by Friday is such that it almost doesn't matter who will play in the semifinals and finals. I invite once again those who are able to come and see the matches live, they will not regret it.

After the matches ended on Thursday night, we talked internally about "Turbo Friday," precisely because of so many great players who are nearing the final. When you see that the first seed and such a great tennis player as Albert Ramos-Vinolas could not play at the stadium, but played at the grandstand, then it is clear between what matches we had to balance to put together a schedule.

In order not follow the predictions, and victories of the "great ones," we have the German Altmaier who reached the semifinals from the qualifications, but nothing was granted to him along the way. He is far better than his current position, as he is around 150th place, but has had injury problems. If he manages to avoid them in the future, he will be very good. This is his first entry into the semifinals at ATP tournaments in his career, I doubt it will remain on just that.

WE WATCH THE STAR BEING BORN

It may sound pretentious, but we can say: a star is born! Carlos Alcaraz reached the second semifinal of the ATP tournaments in his career, after a fantastic match. We expected such a great duel, and we won, and I think that the Umag audience will quickly fall in love with the young Spaniard. He is becoming a real tennis star before our eyes.

Filip Krajinović played a great second set, taking advantage of the somewhat slower entry of the opponent into that section, but the way Carlos played the third set is the best indicator of why he is talked about in superlatives. On Saturday, he will face the toughest possible opponent, first seed Albert Ramos-Vinolas, who easily defeated Stefan Travaglia. an Italian who didn't had a bad day. It will be a replay of Carlos Alcaraz's first match at the ATP tournaments, a match in which he also won his first victory in Rio de Janeiro. I think Ramos is a slight favorite in that match, also a favorite to that extent of winnig the tournament, but it will be open and Carlos has his chances.

On the other side of the draw, we lost the second seed, because the Umag Daniel Altmaier fairy tale goes on. In all previous matches, he lost the first set and made a turnaround, and now he has passed in two sets. The current defender, Dušan Lajović, could not be competitive, because he is hindered by the blister he fought with in Hamburg last week as well. It was visible that he was suffering on the court.

Altmaier will not be an easy ride for Richard Gasquet, who passed Damir Džumhur. Gasquet and Altmaier recently met in Switzerland, the Frenchman won, but anything can happen on Saturday.

As for doubles, we were left without Croatian representatives. Ivan and Matej Sabanov had almost no chance, Brkić and Ćaćić were too good. In the second match, we got probably the greatest tragedy of this tournament, because Radu Albot and Pedro Martinez led 6:4, 5:1 and still lost to the Brazilian-Spanish double Romboli, Vega Hernandez.

ALCARAZ GREAT AGAIN, DEFENDER OF THE TITLE WITHOUT SEMIFINALS



Ramos-Vinolas against Alcaraz and Gasquet against Altmaier - these are the semifinal pairs at the 31st edition of the Plava Laguna Croatia Open! Great tennis was on show on Friday, and Saturday should be just as good, given the game demonstrated by the winning four.

The most attractive clash of the day was, as expected, a duel between 18-year-old Carlos Alca-

raz (pictured) and 29-year-old Filip Krajinović, from which one of the most talented young players of today emerged as the winner. He won 7:6 (3), 2:6, 6:1 and so for the second time this season (and for the second time in his career) he reached the semifinals of an ATP tournament, after he managed to do so earlier in Marbella, Spain.

On Saturday, compatriot Albert Ramos-Vinolas awaits him, whom

he defeated in Rio de Janeiro last year in his debut appearance at the ATP tournaments, when he was only 16 years old. Unlike Alcaraz, Ramos-Vinolas easily moved through the quarterfinals, as he lost only three games against the Italian Travaglia (6: 2, 6: 1). After two setbacks in the Umag quarterfinals, he finally took a step further, and it is interesting that both of them played in the quarterfinals of an ATP tournament for the first time in their careers in Umag: Ramos-Vinolas 2011, and Travaglia 2019.

In the second semifinal, Frenchman Richard Gasquet, once the seventh player in the world, will try to stop the excellent series of German Daniel Altmaier, who surprised the defending champion, Dušan Lajović from Serbia, with 6:2, 6:4 on Friday Altmaier came to the main tournament from the

qualifications, where in the decisive round he was a set and a break point behind the Croatian tennis player Matija Pecotić, but now he has made it all the way to the semifinals. He is awaited by Richard Gasquet, who led 6:3, 4:2 against Damir Džumhur from Bosnia and Herzegovina with three break points for 5:2, before the situation became complicated. Still, he won with 6:3, 7:6.

"If I had taken a 5: 2 lead, the match would probably be over quickly. I didn't succeed, then I got a little stuck on the serve, but I fought to the maximum to win the tie-break," said Gasquet, and when asked if he could go to the end and win the tournament, he added: "I will definitely try to do that. It's a great thing to enter the semifinals with these good players."

DOUBLES FINALS ON SATURDAY

Tomislav Brkić from Bosnia and Herzegovina and Nikola Ćaćić from Serbia stopped Ivan and Matej Sabanov, thereby preventing the Croatian duo from playing in the finals of an ATP tournament for the second time this year. They won 6:1, 6:2 and entered the final, where they will play against Brazilian-Spanish double Fernando Romboli, David Vega Hernandez, on Saturday. Brkić and Ćaćić are the first seed of the tournament, and this season, among others, they were quarterfinalists in Roland Garros, winners in Buenos Aires and finalists in Marbella.



OSCAR'S CORNER

The quarterfinal program on Friday was marked by a duel between Carlos Alcaraz and Filip Krajinović, from which the Spaniard emerged as the winner.

Dušan Lajović did not make it to the semifinals, because he was eliminated in two sets.

On Saturday, we will follow the last four remaining participants in the fight for placement in the finals in Umag: Alcaraz, Altmaier, Ramos-Vinolas and Gasquet.

THE TRIUMPH IN UMAG IS ONE OF MY THREE GREATEST SUCCESSES

The first edition of the Umag ATP tournament was held in the spring of 1990, and the title of winner was Goran Prpić, defeating Goran Ivanišević in the final. Today, more than thirty years later, "Prpa" at the Stella Maris resort remembered those moments:

"Those memories will always be fresh. Especially since it's my only ATP tournament won. It was a great week, I played great tennis and I enjoyed the matches and the new tournament equally. It is also a fact that it's the first one to make it that is remembered. In this case, I am not 'one of the winners,' but the first winner, and that has extra weight. Umag is one of my three biggest successes in my career, so when I say that, it is clear how much winning the title meant to me."

And those three moments are, with the triumph in Umag, winning the Olympic medal in Barcelona in 1992 and placement in the quarterfinals at Roland Garros. In ten days, it will be the 29th anniversary that two Gorans, Prpić and Ivanišević, secured the bronze medal.

"The first moment that stuck in my memory was when we used the match point against Krishnan and Paes and entered the semifinals, which automatically brought a medal. I thought to myself, 'that's it we've made it.' The second moment was the awarding of medals. We don't have podiums in tennis, we don't climb anywhere, but it's different at the Olympics. And that moment, when you take a step to stand on the podium, is something special."

Croatian tennis so far has three medals from the Olympic Games: two from Barcelona (Goran Ivanišević individually, Goran Ivanišević and Goran Prpić in doubles), and one from Athens (Mario Ančić and Ivan Ljubičić in doubles). What

are the chances of the collection expanding in Tokyo?

"Nothing is necessary, but Nikola Mektic and Mate Pavic 'must' win a medal in Tokyo, if I may say so. The way they play, it is clear that gold is expected of them and I am sure that they are not running away from it either. But that imposes the pressure they will have to deal with, so if they succeed with such a burden, the medal will be even more valuable. They were not left without a chance, Marin Čilić both individually and in a doubles with Dodig above all, but the road is difficult," said Prpić.



ANA RUCNER EXCITED THE AUDIENCE!

Our fantastic cellist performed for the audience in Stella Maris and with her extravagant performance introduced us to the final weekend of the Plava Laguna Croatia Open Umag. The world-famous and beautiful Ana Rucner is truly a cello virtuoso, which she showed tonight, leaving the audience breathless.

Tomorrow, Detour will try to do the same, bringing modern electro-acoustic pop sound, a slightly faster and more danceable rhythm spiced with the atmosphere of the French Riviera of the 50s and 60s.







231 ACES ACHIEVED AS PART OF THE AS ZA SPAS CAMPAIGN







