CERUNDOLO TOO MUCH FOR DODIG, MUSETTI WAKES UP JUST IN TIME

Francisco Cerundolo, the fourth-seeded and the 37th best player in the world, proved to be too big of an obstacle for Matej Dodig in the second round of the Plava Laguna Croatia Open. The Croatian player, who turned 19 just a few days earlier, fought hard against the Argentinian, who is the favourite and who won 6:3, 6:4 in the end.

Cerundolo was leading 3:0 only 8 minutes into the game, showing he would be a tough nut to crack. However, after this early lead, the match evened out and Matej only lost one more serve by the end, at 2:2 in the second set. He had his final chance to come back when the Argentinian had a match serve at 5:4, since he started the game with 0-30, but Cerundolo made four points in a row and secured the win in his first Umag match.

“There is a big mismatch in quality of the opponents when compared to the Challengers, but this is certainly a motivation to keep going forward. After the initial 0:3, all I wanted was to win a game on my serve, expecting it to get easier as it goes on, and it did,” said Dodig and added: “I am very happy with the tournament, and I would like to thank director Tomislav Poljak for giving me a chance.

This was the first time Dodig played in an ATP tournament in his career, and thanks to his victory in the first round, he will move up in the singles rankings by more than 20 places from his current 310th spot, and on Monday, he will have his career-best position.

The second seed and one of the favourites in the tournament, Italy’s Lorenzo Musetti, didn’t have a good opening against the Argentinian qualified player Marco Tringelitti,

but he woke up in time and won 6:4, 6:3, and he passed through into the quarter-finals. The Argentinian player opened with a 3:0 lead, but he won only one of the following 7 game points, and had no more break points by the end of the match. Musetti currently holds the 17th place in the ATP rankings, and less than a month ago he played in the semi-finals of Wimbledon and the finals of Queen’s.

In the quarter-final match, Musetti will face off against a former champion of Umag, Dušan Lajović from Serbia, who defeated Italy’s Flavio Cobolli 7:6 (5), 7:6 (3). The closing of the second set was particularly thrilling, as Lajović had a 5:2 lead, and then a 6:5 lead with his serve, but he didn’t manage to break his opponent’s advances until the tie-break.

Another former Umag champion, Italy’s Fabio Fognini, wasn’t even close to a win, as he managed to snag only one game in his match against Taiwanese Chun-Hsin Tseng (6:1, 6:0). Tseng was defeated in the last round of qualifications, but managed to get into the main tournament as a “lucky loser” once Denmark’s Rune bowed out. He took his spot and didn’t have to play in the first round.

In the last match of the day, the 18-year-old Czech player Jakub Menšík once again showed everyone what makes him one of the greatest talents on the global tennis stage. He started out falling behind (1:3), but he fought back and won 6:4, 6:3 in the end. This is his third quarter-finals this season, and he placed in all of them on different courts. Hard surface in Doha, and grass in Mallorca.

BATTLE FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE IN THE 5TH ITF WHEELCHAIR CROATIA OPEN UMAG BY HEP SEES LAST YEAR'S WINNER LUCA ARCA AND FIVE CROATIAN PLAYERS

On Wednesday, the drawing ceremony for the 5th annual ITF Wheelchair Croatia Open Umag by HEP was held in Umag. A total of 16 players will participate in the tournament, including 5 Croatian players.

A Croatian duel opens the very first round, when the tournament's organiser and best ranked Croatian wheelchair player Anto Joskić faces off against invitation holder Željko Kladarić.

When it comes to the remaining three Croatian players, Sven Maretić faces Italy's Roberto Sodero in the first round, Antonijo Arambašić plays against Hungarian Attila Farkas, while Ante Kolundžija fights Korean Sang-Ho Oh for his spot in the quarter-finals.

The first-seeded player and last year's champion, Luca Arca, as well as Martin Legner, Jozef Riegler and Sung-Bong Han have a free pass into the quarter-finals.

"We are delighted to be back in Umag because, since starting this tournament, wheelchair tennis advanced hugely in Croatia. This week, for the first time ever, we have three players in the Top 100, and from this year on we will have seven international ITF tournaments in six different cities in Croatia, which is a huge number.

This tournament had a particular role in popularising our sport, so we are thrilled to be here again, and we're looking forward to this 5th annual tournament," said Anto Joskić.

All first-round matches will be played on Thursday, at the Umag Tennis Academy courts, while on Friday and Saturday they move to the Stella Maris courts.

I wouldn't be surprised to see him lift up the trophy on Saturday."

After the interview, we had the traditional quiz, this time on interesting moments from the first round of the Croatia Open, and the top three contestants won valuable prizes.



HIDDEN CHARM OF ISTRIAN WINE: AN EVENING DEDICATED TO SAUVIGNON BLANC

In summer months, some prefer white wines, and the fourth evening of wine tastings during the Hidden Charm of Istrian wine was dedicated to Sauvignon Blanc, the semi-aromatic variety, together with Gewürztraminer and Riesling. The wine tasting was hosted by the sommelier Lucija Matijević, who was once again ready to share all her knowledge of wines.

Three wineries had their Sauvignons in the running: Vina Zigante, Vinarije Tomaz, and Vinarije Franković. Participants in the tasting didn't know which wine they were tasting, but representatives from the wineries shared some information about themselves.

All wines in the Franković winery were named after their horses, and grapes for their wines are harvested in two or three stages. The Tomaz winery is situated near Motovun, and it spreads over 27 hectares, three of which are used for Sauvignon. In Vina Zigante, Sauvignon grapes are harvested manually, fermented for 15 days and kept in stainless steel barrels for 6 months.

The winning wine of the evening was wine C, while wine A was in the second place, and wine B in the third.

HAVING THE FINAL MATCH ON A SATURDAY MIGHT BECOME A NEW TRADITION



Before the start of this year's Plava Laguna Croatia Open, there was a lot of discussion on the topic of the tournament schedule. That's understandable as, after all, the Olympic Games are happening this year, but our timing in the ATP calendar is always intriguing. This year's Games made it a bit easier and simpler for us, as they are being held in Europe and on clay courts, just like our tournament. This is why it was much easier for us to get players for our tournament, unlike in the year of the Tokyo Olympics.

If we're talking future – the Umag tournament will remain as it is and we will make no other changes. It goes without saying that there will be many years when our tournament will come immediately before the Masters 1000 tournaments in Canada (Montreal or Toronto), and this will be an additional challenge when it comes to attracting players. However, everything we are doing here in Umag, everything Plava Laguna gives us, and this wonderful audience which has been selling out both the Goran Ivanišević central stadium and the Studenac Arena, greatly contributes to the recognition of the tournament and to attracting players.

This year, one of the novelties is the final match taking place on a Saturday. We are all in unknown territory in this sense and it will be interesting to see how the audience reacts to the change. We've never done this before, but we might continue this practice in the future, as Canadian Masters tournaments will be starting on Sunday. Barring any significant changes in the calendar, in the next 15 years Umag will be played immediately before the Canadian tournaments 11 or 12 times, so our current plans are to continue having the final match take place on a Saturday.

This pilot-year might become a tradition, and it is sure to make us rethink some things and bring about some new creative ideas. It will motivate us to look more to the future, to young players who are just starting to make their way in the world. We've shown how good we are at this, and the best possible confirmation is the list of players who have played at Stella Maris during the 3 or 4 previous seasons, and who are the best players in the world today, or close to it.

DODIG COULD BE A VERY, VERY GOOD PLAYER



I'd like to congratulate Matej Dodig on playing a good tournament. My praises might seem too much to some, as he had one victory and one loss, but his victory meant so much, while his defeat against Cerundolo will serve as a learning opportunity, and he had the chance to see what a match against one of the world's greats feels like. Of course, no one expected him to defeat the Argentinian player, but he played a very good match and saw what he needed to work on so that he can beat a player of this calibre in the future. All in all, it was a good match.

Matej has just turned 19 a few days ago, so he has many seasons to go. I like how he is surrounded by a good atmosphere, so to say, he is a positive person. And I love the way he plays tennis. I think he has what it takes to become a very, very good player once he improves his game a bit. We've seen what he can do, and now it's up to him and his team to work on improvements in all aspects. Once this happens, we'll be waiting for him in Umag and he will have even more of a chance to achieve great results.

I wasn't able to watch Musetti's match, but his victory was definitely expected. He's filled with confidence after playing the Wimbledon semi-finals, and this

is a good preparation for him for the Olympics, so he wants to make the most of this tournament. He won't have it easy though, because he's going up against Menšik, who we've seen in a very good form against Darderi.

I have to admit I was a bit surprised with the outcome of that match. Darderi was never my number one favourite to win the tournament, but I've always known he was capable of greatness. I wasn't expecting a defeat like this one, Menšik took him down ruthlessly, but it was deserved. For an 18-year-old player, the Czech already has it all: amazing serve, backhand and forehand... He did wonderfully, the conditions suited him perfectly, and all I can say is – amazing job.

The tournament is now entering its final stage, and the quarter-finals are filled with all of the top-seeded players, which is great for the tournament. I expect Menšik to defeat Tseng, and in the Musetti – Lajović match, I think the Italian has an advantage. In the Rublev – Marozsan duel, I'm not sure because I'm not a fan of how Rublev is currently playing, so it's 50-50. Finally, I believe Cerundolo will snag the victory against Sonogo.
